COVID PROTOCOLS FOR 2022 SUMMER CAMPS

Welcome to Camp!

Thank you for choosing Live Arts summer camps. We can't wait to meet your young theater artist! As always, the health and safety of our community is our top priority. Please read the following guidelines and expectations carefully, as they differ slightly from our [general Live Arts protocols](#) for volunteers, audiences, and guests. Mask & Vaccination Policies

While at camp, masks will be optional for campers, counselors, and teaching artists. While your camper does not need to wear a mask throughout most of the day, **they should plan to bring a mask with them to camp, just in case.** We also will have masks available here at Live Arts for any campers who may forget!

If your child has been vaccinated, please send proof of vaccination to Ti at ti@livearts.org! Just so you know, we do not keep a record of vaccinations for privacy reasons.

All summer staff members and Live Arts staff members are fully vaccinated.

Self-Testing for All Campers

All campers are required to have a negative COVID rapid test the weekend before each camp begins (Saturday or Sunday). Parents/guardians should send a quick photo of their negative test result to Ti at ti@livearts.org. Each household is eligible for free COVID tests from the US government, so please visit <https://www.covid.gov/tests> to order free COVID tests.

What To Do If ...

Your camper is showing COVID symptoms:

Please keep them at home until symptoms fully subside and take a COVID test! Please make sure to contact Ti with your negative results. COVID symptoms include:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Your camper receives a positive COVID test result:

Please keep your camper at home until they test negative for COVID (at least five days after their initial positive test). Contact Ti (ti@livearts.org) and let them know that your camper has a positive test result.

Your camper has been exposed to someone at Live Arts who tested positive:

Campers who came in close contact with someone who tested positive (in or out of camp) will be asked to perform a supplemental rapid test 5-7 days after their exposure. They will also be asked to wear a mask in public indoor spaces for 10 days following the potential exposure or until they receive a negative test result. Campers who are fully vaccinated do not need to quarantine after a potential exposure unless they develop symptoms.

Safety Precautions at Live Arts During Camp

- All campers will be asked to wash or sanitize their hands at multiple points during the camp day.

- Campers will maintain at least three feet of distance from other campers in their cohort as often as possible.
- While campers may go without masks per CDC guidance, they will be asked to maintain six feet of distance from others while eating, drinking, or talking closely for prolonged periods.
- No sharing of drinks and snacks, for allergy and wellness reasons.
- Please make sure someone is available at all times to come and pick your camper up should they fall ill during the camp day.
- All indoor activities at camp will take place in well-ventilated areas with HEPA filters running at all times.
